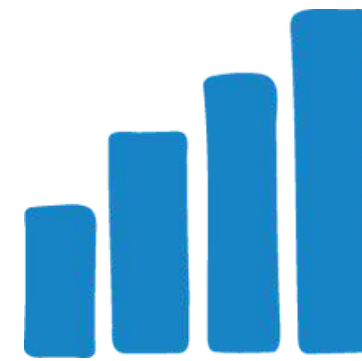
# Promoting a love of reading
